NZ WINDFARMS LIMITED: TE RERE HAU REPOWER PROJECT REFERRED TO EXPERT CONSENTING PANEL UNDER THE COVID-19 RECOVERY (FAST-TRACK CONSENTING) ACT 2020

On 25 March 2022, the Company announced that the Minister for the Environment, the Hon David Parker, had decided to accept the Company's application to refer the Te Rere Hau wind farm repowering project (Project) to an expert consenting panel (Panel) for consideration under the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (FTCA).

This announcement was conditional on receiving an Order in Council for the Project. NZ Windfarms is pleased to announce that it has received the Order in Council to have the project referred to a Panel for consideration under the FTCA. This is attached to the pdf version of the NZX release.

Importantly, the Minister's decision to refer the Project to a Panel under the FTCA, should not be taken as an indication or direction that resource consents will be granted. Additionally, the referral decision does not in any way endorse any related planning decisions that may affect the Project.

Mr Warren Koia NZ Windfarms Chief Executive says "The next steps in the process will be the continuation of consultation with affected parties, the community, iwi and stakeholders, finalisation of the proposed design and layout and the development of a resource consent application and assessment of environmental effects. Once that is complete the Company will be able to file an application with the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) to have its resource consent application considered by a Panel under the FTCA. An application could occur later in the year".

About NZ Windfarms Limited

NZ Windfarms Ltd is a long term specialist wind farm owner and operator, with its revenue coming from the sale of sustainably generated electricity from its Te Rere Hau wind farm.

The Te Rere Hau wind farm is located on North Range Road in the Tararua Ranges outside of Palmerston North. The wind farm has 92 turbines with a capacity of 46 MW producing enough clean energy to power about 16,000 homes, or in excess of half the households in Palmerston North. In comparison to generate the same amount of energy, a gas-fired power plant would emit roughly 64,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide, the same as an additional 23,000 cars on the road.

1 Title

This order is the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Referred Projects Amendment Order (No 8) 2022.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 22 April 2022.

3 Principal order

This order amends the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Referred Projects Order 2020.

1 Name of project

The name of the project is the Te Rere Hau Wind Farm Repowering (the **project**).

2 Authorised person

The authorised person for the project is NZ Windfarms Limited.

3 Description of project

The scope of the project is to redevelop and expand the existing Te Rere Hau wind farm by—

- (a) removing 97 2-blade, 47-metre-high turbines; and
- (b) installing 30 3-blade, 162-metre-high turbines; and
- (c) constructing associated infrastructure, including—
 - (i) upgrading the existing underground transmission line connecting the wind farm to the national electricity grid; or
 - (ii) installing a new overhead transmission line.

4 Description of activities involved in project

The project may involve the following activities:

- (a) the Minister of Energy and Resources; and
- (b) Ngā Kaitiaki o Ngāti Kauwhata Incorporated; and
- (c) Transpower New Zealand Limited.

8 No further provision required

No further provision is necessary to give effect to decisions made by the Minister under section 24 of the Act in respect of the project.

Statement of reasons

This statement of reasons is published for the purposes of clause 4 of Schedule 3 of the Act

The Minister for the Environment has accepted this application for referral. The Minister considered the application against the criteria in the COVID-19 Recovery (Fasttrack Consenting) Act 2020 (the **Act**) and the Act's purpose, and sought and considered written comments from the relevant Ministers, the Tararua District Council, the rizons Regional Council and Transnower Ne

Palmerston North City Council, the Horizons Regional Council, and Transpower New Zealand Limited. The Minister has accepted this application for the following reasons:

- the project will help to achieve the purpose of the Act:
- the project will provide infrastructure to improve economic, employment and environmental outcomes:
- the project will generate employment by providing approximately 197 direct full-time equivalent (FTE) jobs over a 3-year construction period, and 40 ongoing direct FTE jobs once construction is complete:
- the project will contribute to New Zealand's efforts to mitigate climate change and to transition more quickly to an economy of low greenhouse gas emissions by increasing New Zealand's total amount of renewable energy generation:
- the project is likely to progress faster than would otherwise be the case under the Resource Management Act 1991 standard processes:
- any actual and potential effects on the environment, and proposed measures to avoid, remedy, mitigate, offset, or compensate for any adverse effects, can be appropriately tested by an expert consenting panel against Part 2 of the Resource Management Act 1991 and the purpose of the Act.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 22 April 2022, amends the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Referred Projects Order 2020. The effect of the amendment is to refer a project to an expert consenting panel for the purpose of the COVID-19 Recovery (Fast-track Consenting) Act 2020 (the **Act**). The referred project is the project named and described in *new Schedule 50*.

The effect of the referral is to authorise NZ Windfarms Limited to apply under the Act, instead of under the Resource Management Act 1991, for resource consents relating to the project described in *new Schedule 50*.

The expert consenting panel will be appointed under Schedule 5 of the Act and make decisions in accordance with Schedule 6 of the Act.
