Description of this fund

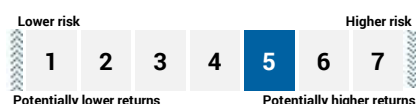
Invests in Japanese shares and is designed to track the return (before tax, fees and other expenses) on the MSCI Japan ESG Screened Index.

Total value of the fund: \$24,063,461

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Smartshares Japan Equities ESG ETF¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

What fees are investors charged?

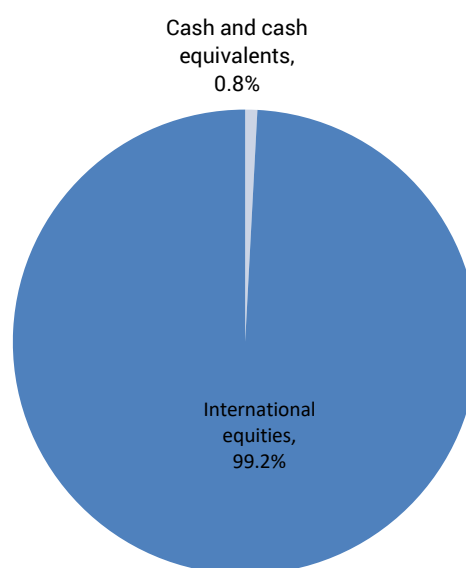
Example of how this applies to an investor

Tara had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Tara received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,714 (that is 17.14% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Tara a total return after tax of \$1,714 for the year.

Notes
