What is the purpose of this update?

Description of this fund

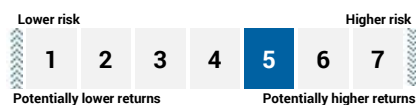
Invests in listed infrastructure securities in developed countries and is designed to track (before tax, fees and other expenses) the FTSE Developed Core Infrastructure 50/50 Index, hedged to the New Zealand Dollar.

Total value of the fund: \$14,300,646

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Smartshares Global Infrastructure ETF¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the Smartshares Global Infrastructure ETF are charged fund charges. Based on the Product Disclosure Statement dated 26 June 2023, these are expected to be:

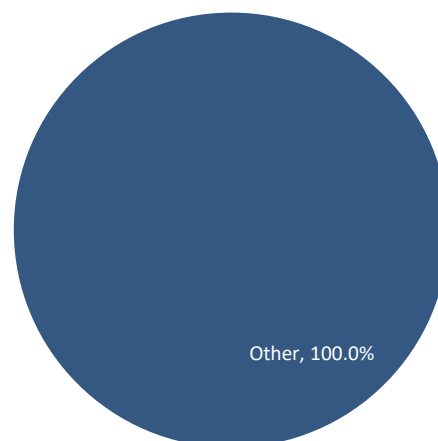
Example of how this applies to an investor

Tara had \$10,000 in the fund on 29 June 2023 and did not make any further contributions. On 30 June 2023, Tara received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$101 (that is 1.01% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Tara a total return after tax of \$101 for the 0 months and 2 days.

Currency hedging

As at 30 June 2023 the fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 100.71%, of which 99.66% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 0.34% of the net asset value of the fund. Notes

- 1 Market index returns (as well as actual returns) have been used to complete the risk indicator, as the fund has not been in existence for 5 years. As a result, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. The risk indicator for the fund uses 5 years of market index returns.
- 2 These charges refer to the normal fund operating costs that are charged to the fund. For disclosure purposes, supervisor, audit and legal costs are not included in the manager's basic fee, but are included in the other management and administration charges. Some of these are fixed costs so the amount shown can range from 0% up to the total fund charges depending on the total value of the fund.
- 3 The 'other' category refers to an investment in infrastructure. The underlying investments are infrastructure securities listed in developed countries.
- 4 The top 10 investments listed in the table exclude current assets and current liabilities, and as a result do not sum to 100%.
